## **DAVID TEMPLETON TO PERFORM AT A FREE CONCERT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON, BOTHELL**

(Bothell, WA)-- Enjoy a free afternoon concert on Thursday, April 11<sup>th</sup> with Puget Sound resident and University of Washington graduate David Templeton. The concert will be held on campus at the North Creek Café from 4 p.m. until 5:30 p.m.

Templeton, who has been playing the piano since the age of three, will play songs from his many albums that highlight his passionate classical compositions, which have made him a favorite with his legion of fans.

“The source of my inspiration varies from people I’ve known to places I’ve been, to those that I dream of knowing,” says Templeton. “Sometimes I get inspired by walks along the beach around Seattle and spending time in Washington State’s beautiful San Juan Islands.”

His first album, *Time Alone*, was recorded in 1985 at Seattle’s historic Paramount Theater. The second album, *Promise*, was nominated for "Recording of the Year" by the Northwest Area Music Association and was released by the New Yorker Magazine.

Templeton has also released an album called *The Deepest Water*, “perhaps the softest of the three solo piano albums,” he says.

Templeton’s fourth, and most recent album, entitled, *Change*, features guitar, violin, piano, keyboards and percussion. “The result is a very full sound, flowing from symphonies to piano concertos to cool beat ethereal,” says Templeton.
